# The value of a college education

College degree opens a world of career, employment, socio-economic opportunities that rarely exist without a degree.

People who earn a college degree make \$1million more than those who do not earn a college degree

Studies have also shown that as the level of education increases, so does job satisfaction.

# The value of a college education: Why a STEM degree

- Opportunity to contribute to and be apart of cutting-edge innovation
- >STEM-savvy citizens
- >STEM workers earn 26% more than non-STEM workers
- >STEM degree holders earn more (even if they don't work in a STEM field)
- STEM degree holders are less likely to be unemployed

# The value of a college education: Why a STEM degree

➤ Over the past 10 years, STEM jobs have grown 3 times faster than non-STEM jobs

>STEM jobs are projected to grow by 17% from 2008-2018, compared to 9.8% for non-STEM occupations

## **COST OF ATTENDANCE**

- Tuition (courses—covered by Science Bound!)
- Fees (CyRide, health facility, printing, rec facilities, student clubs & organizations)
- Housing and meals (rent, food on- or offcampus; estimated)
- Books and supplies (estimated)
- Personal expenses (shampoo, toothpaste, daily essentials, coffee, estimated)

# Helpful tips in choosing housing:

- Review options at <a href="https://housing.iastate.edu/places">housing.iastate.edu/places</a>
- Typically suites in Union Drive and Buchanan Hall are the most expensive
- Students living in Wallace or Wilson (Towers Neighborhood) do not have to have a meal plan, but access to kitchens is limited
- Traditional buildings with no A/C is least expensive: Friley, Helser, Oak, Elm, Birch Welch Roberts, Willow, Wallace, Wilson

# **Iowa State Meal Plans**

#### **Cardinal (Default Plan)**

- Anytime access to Friley Windows, Union Drive Marketplace, and Seasons dining centers
- GET & GO 2 meals per day (2 locations to choose from first-floor UDCC and Conversations in Oak-Elm)
- \$250 <u>Dining Dollars</u> per semester / \$500 per year
- 5 Guest Meals per academic year
- \$2432 per semester / \$4864 per year

#### **Gold Plan**

- 210 meals per semester with access to Friley Windows, Union Drive Marketplace, and Seasons dining centers
- <u>GET & GO</u>– 2 meals per day (2 locations to choose from first-floor UDCC and Conversations in Oak-Elm)
- \$250 <u>Dining Dollars</u> per semester / \$500 per year
- \$2285 per semester / \$4570 per year

\*Meal plan required for on campus housing except for Linden, Wallace or Wilson Hall (2023-2024)

- Talk about college financing and create a plan to pay for college, identifying how much each family member will be contributing.



## WHAT IS THE FAFSA?

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- •File by deadline at <u>fafsa.gov</u>
- Federal & school-specific aid



# WHAT IF I HAVE TO TAKE OUT STUDENT LOANS?

#### **FEDERAL STUDENT LOANS**

- File the FAFSA
- Eligible for up to \$5,500 as a first-year student
- Loan amount increases with grade level in school

#### **FEDERAL PARENT LOAN**

 Separate creditbased application after the FAFSA is filed

#### **PRIVATE LOANS**

- Credit-based application through a bank or credit union
- Students must have a cosigner
- Interest rate and terms vary by lender
